WELCOME TO DAY CAMP

Here are a few reminders to help your week go smoothly:

- **PARKING IS LIMITED . . .** Please plan to drop off and/or car pool wherever possible. Although it may be tempting, do not park anywhere other than a marked parking space. Cars parked in unauthorized areas *WILL* be ticketed by the Orange County Sheriff's Department.
- Try to organize your carpool to drop off kids & gear at the gathering area and then proceed to park. That way, if you park on the Mesa you don't have to "hike with the kids".
- Please make sure to pack: a good lunch, sunscreen, water bottles and hat for your boy(s) every day.
- Enclosed shoes for *EVERYONE* (youth & adults). No sandals, heels or slip-ons. Please be sure all apparel is scouting appropriate.

SIBLING CAMP REMINDERS

Siblings must remain in the sibling campsite during program sessions. They may not attend scout activities with their parents. As a parent volunteer, you are there to oversee a group of boys and scouting ratios are being met. Check your siblings in to Sibling Camp before the session begins. You may pickup-up your siblings at lunch time or pack them a lunch and they can stay in sibling camp. Please place lunch in a labeled ziplock bag (ants!).

SIBLING PICK-UP PROCEDURE: Siblings will be brought to the Gathering Area at the end of the day. You will pick them up and sign them out there instead of at sibling camp.

State Law requires that a parent must be onsite at all times if you have a child in Sibling Camp. If you need to leave camp for any reason, you must take your sibling camper with you.

WATER DAY ALERT

No summer is complete without water! Please be advised that your son(s) will be participating in water sports on the following days:

- ALL Campers: Friday
- Webelos: ALL WEEK in Webelos Aquatics

You may want to send your son to camp wearing swim trunks instead of regular shorts. In addition, please send a towel (one that can get wet and dirty) so the boys can dry off. You may also want to bring trash bags for wet clothing and/or protection for car interiors for the ride home.

TO OUR WONDERFUL ADULT VOLUNTEERS

We will once again be distributing \$10 Day Camp Gift Certificates to any adult volunteer working three days or more at Day Camp. They can be picked up at Headquarters Wednesday through Friday any time after the end of your third day. These certificates are valid at any Orange County Scout Shop. Thanks for all you do for the boys!

VISITORS TO CAMP

Only adults registered with daycamp will be allowed on site. ALL adults must check in each day at the **ADULT CHECK-IN TABLE** in the gathering area. Each registered adult volunteer will be given a wristband. The wristband will be changed daily. Adults without wristbands will not be allowed to stay in camp. We are not allowed to accept on site registration.

Thank you for your help and cooperation in keeping our kids safely supervised.

ROAD TRIP

Cubs and Webelos will be cruising the county in the *American Adventure's Route 66 Road Trip* (aka: pushcarts). Each camper is required to wear a helmet for this adventure. The camp has some helmets for the boys to wear, but campers are encouraged to bring their own bike helmet if possible.
